



Paul G. Nahon, III Memorial GHS Tennis Scholarship *Guidelines*

- 1. Name:** Paul G. Nahon, III Memorial GHS Tennis Scholarship Fund
- 2. Established:** 2013
- 3. Amount:** Each year an award of at least \$500 will be awarded to an outstanding girl tennis player in the fall, and an outstanding boy tennis player in the spring.
- 4. Purpose:** To assist students in continuing their education at a college, university, technical, trade or vocational school.
- 5. Criteria:**
 - A. Applicant must be a graduating student from Glendale High School in the Springfield R-12 Public School system and have been on the GHS Tennis Team for at least two years.
 - B. Applicant must enroll in a college, university, technical, trade or vocational school upon graduation from high school.
 - C. The student must share the same determination, spirit, citizenship and sportsmanship that was demonstrated by Paul.
- 6. Procedure:**
 - A. Scholarship will be awarded annually to a graduating senior from Glendale High School.
 - B. Student must complete the Paul G. Nahon, III Memorial GHS Tennis Memorial Scholarship application and have at least one letter of recommendation from a high school teacher or counselor.
 - C. A scholarship selection committee of the head tennis coach, Glendale counselors and teachers will make their recipient recommendation to the Foundation for

Springfield Public Schools. The Foundation will verify that the recommended recipient meets all established criteria.

- D. After receiving proof of enrollment from the student, the Foundation shall send a check payable to that institution.
- E. The scholarship will not be renewable. If there is no suitable applicant for a particular academic year, the scholarship will not be awarded that year only and will be awarded the following year based on the same protocol.
